

City of Hendersonville Recycles

Make recycling as easy as 1, 2, 3!

First, decide on a storage area. The kitchen, where most household refuse originates, is an ideal place for a home recycling center. Put it in a place where you'll remember to use it such as under the sink or in a closet or pantry. A location in the garage or near a back door can also be used for storage.

Second, take every opportunity to fill your recycling bins with properly prepared recyclable materials. You will be provided with blue recycling bins for all of your recycling materials.

Third, place your recycling bins at the curb by 7 a.m. on Friday. If you have more recyclables than will fit into your bins, place extra materials in a reusable, open container next to your bin so it is not confused with trash. Please do not use plastic or trash bags for storing recyclables. A maximum of six (6) bins per household will be collected.

Other Materials

Appliances:

Residents may place appliances curbside to be picked up by the City. Please call in advance and let the City know that you will be placing an item by the curb for collection. Appliances include water heaters, trash compactors, washing machines, dryers, refrigerators (detach doors), and freezers (detach door) which are sold as scrap metal at local metal recycling facilities.



Yard Waste:

Residents may place regular amounts of brush and limbs out for collection on their regular garbage collection day to be picked up by the City. The limbs and brush are hauled to our yard waste facility and ground into mulch then given back to the residents at no charge. Please do not place the material in the road or on the sidewalk. Place the brush behind the sidewalk or curb if there is no sidewalk.

Bulk Leaf Collection:

Bulk leaf collection occurs from October 15th until December 31st and for the month of March each year. The leaves are given away as a garden additive or included in our mulch program. Please do not rake, blow or pile the leaves in the road or on the sidewalk. This impairs vehicular and pedestrian traffic plus can cause flooding when the leaves are washed to a storm drain. Place the leaves behind the sidewalk or curb, if there is no sidewalk.

Paint:

Allow the paint to dry then dispose of it in your regular household garbage. To speed up the drying process, add sand or kitty litter to the paint.

Used Motor Oil and Antifreeze:

The City does not collect these materials. Please recycle them at the Henderson County Transfer Facility which is located at 802 Stoney Mountain Road, Hendersonville.

Tires:

Residents can place tires curbside for collection by the City as long as the tire is not on a rim. The tires can also be recycled at the Henderson County Transfer Station.

Batteries:

Lead acid (car) batteries are best recycled at the location from which you purchase a new battery or Henderson County Transfer Station. Most alkaline batteries (common batteries) are not recyclable and can be thrown away with regular household garbage. What to Recycle and How:

The following can be placed in the City's blue recycling bins:

Aerosol Cans, empty with plastic cap removed
Brown Paper Grocery Bags
Cans, aluminum, steel and tin
Catalogs
Cereal Boxes
Construction Paper
Corrugated Cardboard, flat, size limit 4'x 3' x 12" stack
Egg Cartons
Envelopes, paper, plastic windows, & manila with clasp
Frozen Food Box, white inside
Glass Bottles and Jars, brown, green and clear only
Glossy Paper
Junk Mail
Magazines
Newspaper & Inserts
Paper, office, shredded if bagged and sealed, & post it notes
Paperback Books
Phone Books
Soda / Beer Cartons
Toilet & Paper Towel Rolls
TV Guides
Wrapping Paper
All Plastic Bottles, (containers #1-7)



MATERIALS BANNED FROM LANDFILLS:

The following items can no longer be thrown away with your regular household garbage, they must be recycled.

- Corrugated Cardboard
- Rigid Plastic Bottles (as of October 1, 2009)
(Rigid plastic bottles have a neck and lid)
- Oil Filters (as of October 1, 2009)
- Wood Pallets (as of October 1, 2009)
- Aluminum Cans
- Yard Trash
- Used Tires
- Lead Acid Batteries
- Glossy Paper
- White Goods or Appliances
- Bottles from ABC Permitted businesses

Special Waste:

Household Hazardous Waste and Electronics

City of Hendersonville does not collect household hazardous waste. Please contact the Henderson County Solid Waste Department to determine the next scheduled collection event. Electronics should be recycled at appropriate locations which includes Henderson County Transfer Station on Convenience Center Drive off of Stoney Mountain Road. Monday through Saturday between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm.

Effective July 1, 2015 televisions must be disposed of at the transfer station for a fee of \$10.00 per TV.

Other Efforts:

Recycling Fluorescent and Compact Fluorescent Light bulbs

Residents can drop off compact fluorescent light bulbs, not tubes, at the customer service counter of any Home Depot store or they may also order at-home fluorescent tube and compact fluorescent bulb recycling kits from Waste Management at www.thinkgreenfromhome.com



Recycling Clothing and House Wares

Thrift stores take gently used items such as clothing and house wares. Call to see what they accept and when they take deliveries. Some stores will pick up large items including furniture.

Food and Yard Scraps

Most food scraps including coffee grounds, egg shells, and vegetables make good compost material. Add food scraps free of meat, fat or bones to leaves and grass clippings. Keep well watered and turn often. In 4-6 months, you should have good soil enrichment. For additional information about composting call your local [North Carolina Cooperative Extension Service](#) or [Henderson County Transfer Station](#). Henderson County also has backyard compost bins for sale.

Grocery Bags

Most local grocery stores have containers for the collection of plastic grocery bags.

Wire Hangers

Most dry cleaners will accept wire hangers for reuse. Call your local cleaners for more information.

Packaging Materials

Some local mailing services may accept styrofoam peanuts and reuse these materials. Please contact them directly using the yellow pages to see if they are accepting material.
