DOWNTOWN PROGRAM INFORMATION

Downtown Hendersonville is a nationally accredited Main Street Program. Main Street Communities use a comprehensive downtown revitalization process developed by the National Trust for Historic Preservation to encourage economic development within the context of historic preservation.


The Downtown Division of the City of Hendersonville Community Development Department works to improve the Main Street and 7th Avenue Municipal Service Districts.

Funding:

The Downtown Division is funded by Municipal Service District tax on the Main Street and 7th Avenue Districts, and a percentage of sales tax.

Downtown & 7th Avenue Municipal Service District
 \$.21 tax per \$100 valuation

The Friends of Downtown Hendersonville is a 501c3 nonprofit arm of the Downtown Division. The Friends budget includes income and expenses related to events: Rhythm & Brews Summer Concert Series, Bearfootin' Artwalk and Auction, and the Hendersonville Farmers Market. New in 2023 the Friends have taken over management of Garden Jubilee.

HISTORIC PRESERVATION TAX CREDITS

Historic PreservationTax Credits

Main Street and 7th Avenue are both in Nationally Registered Historic Districts. This means buildings within those districts may qualify for historic tax credits for building rehabilitation.

Owners and developers may potentially receive a 20% federal income tax credit and a 15-25% state income tax credit for certified rehabilitation of income-producing historic structures.

EXAMPLE FOR INCOME- PRODUCING PROPERTIES

x 20% Federal Tax Credit





Improving the Facade?


Properties within the 7th Avenue and Main Street Municipal Service Districts (MSDs) are eligible for a Facade Improvement Grant.





The Main Street Historic District is a locally designated historic district. Buildings within the boundaries require a Certificate of Appropriateness approved by the <u>Historic</u> Preservation Commission.

BUSINESS STARTUP QUICK TIPS

- Contact us for opportunities on spaces, training and financing hvlopp.org!
- Prepare a business plan that outlines your business goals, operating procedures, competitors, as well as the company's current and desired funding.
- Incorporate your business or form an LLC. It provides the owner with personal asset protection from the debts and liabilities of the company.
- Select an accountant and attorney you can turn to for advice when starting out, as well as throughout the life of the business. Consider a local, downtown provider to have assistance right next door.
- Set up your business accounting/bookkeeping. Be prepared to account for all disbursements, payments received, invoices, accounts receivable/payable, etc.
- Obtain business insurance. Discuss your particular industry and business needs with your insurance agent to obtain the appropriate type and amount of insurance.
- Ensure you comply with government requirements (e.g., unemployment insurance, worker's compensation, OSHA, payroll tax requirements, self- employment taxes, etc.).
- Create a logo, business cards, letterhead, envelopes, etc., to build business identity.
- Secure your company's website domain name. Create a website. A company website allows you to establish your brand and will be the first opportunity to make an impression with customers. Claim Google Business Listing.
